JC Taylor. Mr Taylor arrived in Wellington in 1865. His life was an adventurous and active one. as a public man he held a record seldom equalled. He saw service in connection with the Maori Troubles. He was a member of the Masonic Fraternity, joining in Hastings in 1879. For over 25 years he was a Justice of the Peace, and for 16 years a Coroner, Clerk of the Patangata Road Board, 24 years Clerk of the Waipawa Town Board and Chairman of School Committee for a number of years. He was born at Weymouth Marsh, England and married in the colony and leaves a widow and family of eight Vernon, Percy, Fred and Frank (Fred wounded in France) and Mrs Forsyth, Mrs Tonks, Mrs Doles, Mrs Trower. WM Fri July 11 1927.
